MESSAGE FROM THE MYP COORDINATOR



When I was in third or fourth grade, we were asked to write a paragraph on the postman and stick a picture of the postbox. I used a blade instead of scissors and did a very untidy job. My handwriting was also not neat. When the books were returned, the teacher wrote "Very untidy work" and asked me to get my mother's signature. Upset, I cut off the corner of the page with the remark. The next day, the teacher noticed and showed the class, who confirmed it was cut. I was punished by standing outside the classroom. Later, my teacher complained to my mother in front of my classmates, and I dreaded facing her at home.

This experience made me reflect on feedback from parents and teachers. Should it make a child feel bad or help them improve? "The Power of Positive Meaningful Feedback on Student Success" from curiousneuron.com states, "Students should not only hear about errors, they need to know where they stand regarding their knowledge on concepts, whether there were improvements in their effort and where they stand in terms of the goals for that topic or assignment." The article also mentions, "Generic comments such as 'great work' or 'keep up the hard work' are positive, but not meaningful."

If my teacher had said, "Good ideas, Radha. I can see your effort on transitions, which is our goal, and you're doing well there. We need to work on your sentence construction and focus on your handwriting and neatness," I might not have felt so miserable. As teachers and parents, we sometimes blame or praise without acknowledging the quality of work. We merge the product or behavior with the child, saying, "You are lazy and don't put in effort" instead of "Your work shows a lack of effort. Let's discuss your challenges." Or, we say, "Very good" instead of "Your response shows understanding of the topic."

Positive feedback boosts students' self-confidence and influences their effort and grades. We should consider what feedback we would like to receive and ensure it corrects mistakes without hurting self-esteem. The MYP provides criterion-based feedback, allowing teachers to give specific feedback based on task indicators. As parents and teachers, let's be conscious and give our children the feedback we would like to hear.

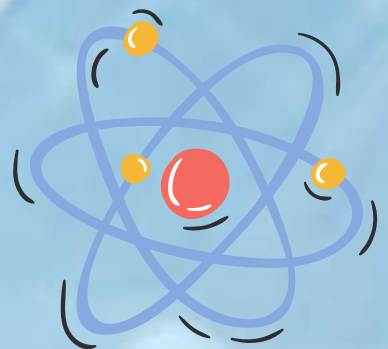
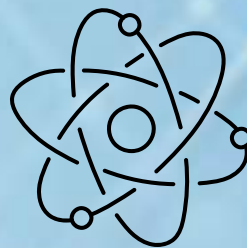




Physics Mela

Personal Project Exhibition

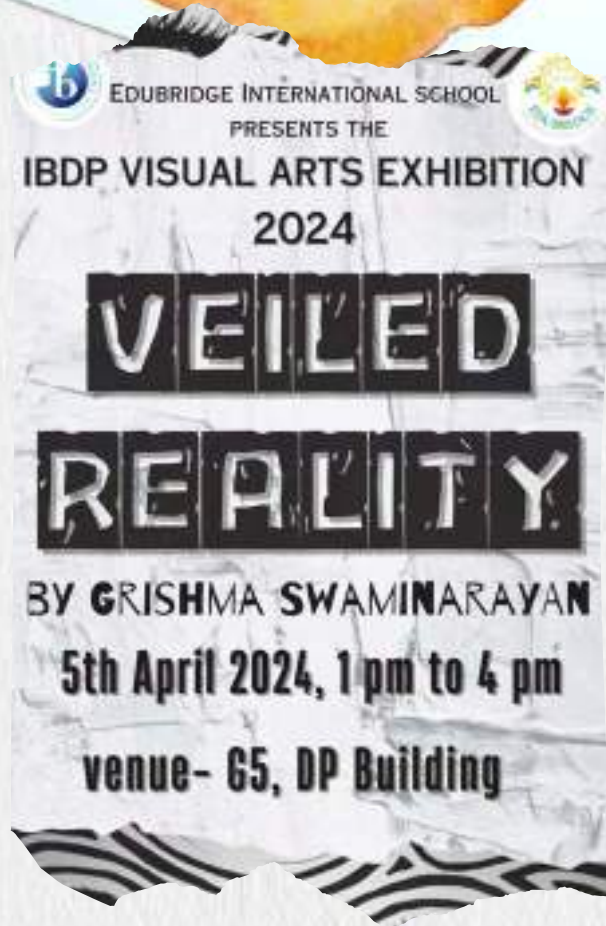
